The fisheries sector in the State of Goa provides a significant contribution to food and nutritional security of the state. Fishing has traditionally been one of the chief occupations and the source of livelihood of the people living in the coastal areas of Goa. The Marine and Inland Fisheries also contribute significantly to the State's economy. In fact this sector has richly contributed to the social and cultural spheres of our State as well.
